There will be a dance/movement audition, but not all characters will be required to dance, it's just to see how much you can move so our production team know who they're working with!

Characters and descriptions as follows:

Characters: The Goodies

Princess Christina:

(f) Lead - daughter of the original sleeping beauty. Turning 18, just coming into herself. Wants freedom and trust. But still naive enough to believe in storybooks. Strong singer. Mover or Dancer.

Taylor:

(m) Love interest, conventionally handsome. Kind, but also very naive. Tries too hard, which has consequences.

Strong singer. Ideally Dancer, but at least Mover.

Queen Rose:

(f) The grown up Sleeping Beauty, over protective of her daughter, tries to ignore anything going wrong.

Strong singer. Movement/Dance is adaptable.

King Troy:

(m) The grown up handsome prince, feels he has peaked - now having midlife crisis. Singing and Movement/Dance are adaptable to performer.

Dame Dolly Doo'Dah:

(m) The Dame, fabulous and has lots of ex-husbands. Has been Nanny to both Queen and Princess

Singing and Movement/Dance are adaptable to performer.

Linda The Good Fairy:

(f) The Good Fairy, everyone expects her to have all the answers. Singing and Movement/Dance are adaptable to performer.

Granville:

(m/f) Servant and audience friend, written as an older character, but does not have to be. Poorly placed to help in The King's midlife crisis of manliness Some singing. Movement/Dance is adaptable.

Sir Vivor:

(m/f) The final surviving Knight in the kingdom. Comic relief. Written as older, but does not have to be

Singing and Movement/Dance are adaptable to performer.

Characters: The Baddies

Nefeiress:

(f) Daughter of the Evil Fairy from the original story - out for revenge! Strong singer. Dance not required.

Foxy:

(m/f) An actual fox that talks - smart & street smart. Clown character. Singing adaptable to performer. Strong Dancer.

Robin:

(m/f) A Bird. Obsessed with musical theatre and constantly singing. Clown Character.

Strong singer. Strong Dancer.

Peacock:

(m) A bird. Obsessed with his appearance. Clown character. Singing adaptable. Dancing required, but can be altered.

While we've listed roles as (m), (f), or (m/f), we warmly welcome auditions from people of all gender identities and expressions, including non-binary, gender fluid, and gender non-conforming performers.
