Introduction

Dealing with Clair is a chilling, psychological thriller. The play is based loosely on the case of estate agent Suzy Lamplugh, who disappeared in 1986 while showing a client round a property. Her body has never been found. Nor has the mysterious Mr Kipper, whose name appeared in her appointments diary, ever been traced. There is a horrible topicality to the theme of the belittlement and vulnerability of young women at the hands of predatory men. The play offers no solution to the Suzy Lamplugh mystery but presents a plausible explanation of the circumstances surrounding her disappearance. The play was first performed at the Orange Tree Theatre, Richmond, in 1988 and subsequently revived at the same theatre in 2018.

Plot

The property market lies at the heart of the play. A dog-eat-dog world, where money talks and traditional notions of morality and ethics don't apply. Mike and Liz are a yuppie couple anxious to secure the best price for their London house. Having accepted an offer from a young couple in Shropshire, they are then faced with the dilemma posed by a higher cash bid from the mysterious art-dealer James. Should they do the honourable thing and stick with the first offer or ditch the young couple and take the cash? Clair is the estate agent caught in the middle, who becomes party to the couple's double-dealing and the object of unhealthy curiosity from the creepy cash buyer James. The play ends with Clair's unexplained disappearance.

Roles

Clair – late 20s/early 30s, estate agent, cool, competent, accommodating, a people pleaser.

James – middle-aged, mysterious, menacing, creepy.

Mike – 30s, middle-class, patronising, smug, greedy, cynical.

Liz – 30s, Mike's wife, middle-class, bright, articulate, assertive.

Anna – Mike & Liz's live-in Italian nanny, young, taciturn. Speaks with an Italian accent.

Ashley - mid 20s, tradesman, sharp, cheerful, friendly.

Vittorio – Italian, mid 20s, Anna's boyfriend. Speaks only Italian.

Toby – mid 20s, another estate agent, smooth

Ashley, Vittorio & Toby may be played by the same actor
